NATIONAL DEFENSE ACT OF 1916: ESTABLISHED THE RESERVE OFFICER'S TRAINING CORPS

ROTC VITALIZATION ACT OF 1964: ESTABLISHED 1,200 UNITS OF JROTC DEPARTMENTS STAFFED BY RETIRED PERSONNEL, RATHER THAN ACTIVE DUTY PERSONNEL.

WOMEN WERE ALLOWED INTO JROTC IN SCHOOL YEAR 1972-1973.

**QUICK TIME** - 30IN STEP WITH A CADENCE OF 120 STEPS PER MINUTE

**DOUBLE TIME** - 30IN STEP WITH A CADENCE OF 180 STEPS PER MINUTE

**HALF STEP**- 15 IN STEP - USED WITH RIGHT/LEFT STEP MARCH, HALF STEP MARCH AND BACKWARD MARCH

**PREPATORY COMMAND** - STATES THE MOVEMENT TO BE EXECUTED- I.E. "RIGHT" IN RIGHT FACE

**COMMAND OF EXECUTION** - TELLS WHEN THE MOVEMENT IS TO BE EXECUTED- I.E. "FACE" IN RIGHT FACE

**COMBINED COMMAND** - WHEN THE PREPATORY COMMAND AND COMMAND OF EXECUTION IS COMBINED - I.E. FALL-IN, AT EASE

**FOUR (4) REST POSITIONS:** REST, PARADE REST, STAND-AT EASE, AT EASE

**CADENCE** - THE UNIFORM RHYTHM IN WHICH A MOVEMENT IS EXECUTED

**FIRST AID** - THE FIRST TREATMENT GIVEN TO A VICTIM TO KEEP HIM OR HER ALIVE BEFORE PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CARE ARRIVES

**EVALUATE A CASUALTY** – RESPONSIVENESS, BREATHING, BLEEDING, SHOCK, BROKEN BONES, BURNS, HEAD INJURIES

**FOUR LIFESAVING STEPS** –

1. OPEN THE AIRWAY, RESTORE BREATHING AND HEARTBEAT
2. STOP BLEEDING
3. CONTROL/ TREAT SHOCK
4. DRESS THE WOUND(S)

**HOW TO STOP BLEEDING** - 1. BANDAGE WITH PRESSURE

**FIRST AID:** (CONT.)

2. PRESSURE POINTS

3. TOURNIQUET- **ABSOLUTE LAST RESORT (Probably lost a limb)** (DO NOT TAKE OFF UNLESS YOU ARE A QUALIFIED PROFESSIONAL)

**TREATMENT OF SHOCK -**

1. KEEP VICTIM WARM/ COOL
2. IF NO HEAD/ NECK/ BACK WOUND, ELEVATE LOWER BODY
3. LOOSEN CLOTHING
4. KEEP VICTIM OCCUPIED (ASK QUESTIONS)

**TWO TYPES OF FRACTURES -** CLOSED (SIMPLE)  
OPEN (COMPOUND)

**THREE (3) TYPES OF HEAT INJURIES:** HEAT CRAMPS, HEAT EXHAUSTION, AND HEAT STROKE

**HEIMLICH MANEUVER:** USED TO CLEAR THE AIRWAY OF A CHOKING VICTIM

**MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION:** USED TO RESTORE THE BREATHING OF A VICTIM

**CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION:** USED TO RESTORE BREATHING AND HEARTBEAT OF A VICTIM
